**INTERIM ORDER**

(Date of Hearing: 13.04.2017)

(Date of Order: 24.04.2017)

1. The instant petition has been filed by Shri Sumit Ramsisaria, under Section 142 of the Electricity Act, 2003 against Tata Power Delhi Distribution Ltd. for violation of the procedure laid down in the Delhi Electricity Supply Code and Performance Standards Regulations, 2007.

2. The matter was listed for hearing in the Commission, which was attended by both the parties. During the hearing, the Counsel for the Petitioner raised question about the assessment of bill stating that when the meter was disconnected in 2011 and no reading was recorded by the meter, how could the Discom take reading for consumption for making assessment bill.
3. The Counsel for the Respondent submitted that the meter was found connected and was recording the consumption at the time of inspection on 31.08.2005. Accordingly the assessment bill was made. He further submitted that he has already furnished copies of the photographs of the meter reading along with the preliminary reply in the matter.
4. The Commission observed that photographs provided by the Respondent were not clear and no inference could be drawn about the reading and the meter, reading of which was shown in the photograph.
5. The Respondent is directed to provide within a week, clear photographs of the meter readings which may also indicate the meter number. The matter is adjourned.
6. The next date of hearing shall be intimated to the parties in due course.
7. Ordered accordingly.
